

WHAT IS IT?

Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports

PBIS is a framework for teaching and reinforcing expected behaviors and providing structure for managing challenging behaviors.

EXPECTED BEHAVIOR

The STAR Matrix is used to teach expected behavior throughout the school. Each letter of STAR stands for a value or character quality.

S- Scholarly T- Thoughtful A- Accountable R- Respectful

The expectations are taught during morning meeting and reviewed consistently throughout the school year.

Class Dojo is used to communicate with families and to record expected behavior and needed reminders




POSITIVE POINTS

These points are green and indicate when your student has demonstrated a STAR behavior. These points are totaled each month.



REMINDER POINTS

These points are yellow and are used to indicate when your student has needed a reminder about STAR behaviors. Points are NOT taken away from total green points.



COMMUNICATION

If your child's teacher has a concern about behavior, they will reach out to you personally via Dojo messages or a phone call.

WHAT CAN BE EARNED?

Students can earn things based on their STAR behavior.



Dojo points can be used each month to purchase items from the school store. These items are all Stroud spirit items!

One student from each classroom is selected each month by homeroom teachers for Scholar of the Month. These students have exhibited STAR behavior. One student from each grade level is selected per month. This is based on the STAR focus for the month (scholarly, thoughtful, accountable, respectful)

Each classroom teacher utilizes their own reward system in their classroom related to STAR behavior achievement.




The following steps are taken to address behavior concerns. Most behaviors are initially handled within the classroom.

STEP 1	Reminder Dojo point, reteach appropriate STAR behavior, make simple changes (i.e. change seat)	STEP 4	If behaviors are unsafe or consistently disruptive, administrator assistance will be requested
STEP 2	Reminder Dojo point, parent contact, reteach STAR behavior, make minor changes (i.e. break in or out of room)	STEP 5	Administration will contact parent
STEP 3	IRepeat step 2; if behavior continues, behavior interventionist support may be requested	STEP 6	If needed, higher level behavior supports will be implemented following team meeting



The primary goal of PBIS is to TEACH appropriate behaviors. It is meant to be positive and rewarding! We are excited to continue developing this process as a school!
