What is Title I?

Classic City High School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act. Title I is designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards and reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents a written parental involvement policy.

Family Engagement Plan

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Classic City will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. Classic City High School values the contributions and involvement of parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Classic City will support parent engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Classic City invited families, staff, and stakeholders to submit comments during our annual Title I Family Engagement Planning Presentation last spring in order to assist us in revising this Family Engagement Plan, as well as the school-wide plan, our school-family compact, and the parental involvement budget. This information is posted on our school website, and feedback is accepted throughout the year. All feedback will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. Families can also give feedback during family engagement events, through direct contact with staff and administration, and during Fall and Spring Parent-Teacher Conferences.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I Part A program and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Classic City will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents speaking limited English, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

The plan is found online in the Title I Resources and Documentation section of the school's website. It is also provided to all parents at Fall Parent-Teacher Conferences and available anytime in the school's Family Resource Center, which is located in the front office.

School-Family Compact

CLAHS students and families will develop a School-Family compact, an agreement which explains how we will work together to make sure all students reach grade-level standards. The compact will be reviewed during parent conferences and updated annually based on feedback obtained throughout the year from parents, students, and teachers at events advertised on our website and through weekly announcements as well as during the Title I Family Engagement Meeting. - Invite parents to help develop the School-Family Compact at events such as the Title I City is committed to helping our parents Family Engagement Planning Meeting, Title I Annual Meeting, PTSO Meetings, and Parent-Teacher Conferences in the Fall and Spring. During Fall Conferences parents will receive the compact, discuss its contents with their student's advisor, and all parties will sign. During Spring Conferences the Compact will be revisited to assess its impact on learning at home.
- Collect feedback from parents' events, provide families opportunities to have their voices heard through multiple means of communication, and ensure families are aware of happenings through calendars, emails, texts, and online postings.
