

“REGISTER” YOUR STUDENT BEFORE 10/18

We are excited to welcome students back to their classrooms!

In-person instruction will begin **Monday, November 9, 2020**, for students in the Office of Early Learning, all students in grades Pre-K - 8, and all students with Low Incidence Disabilities (LID). High School students will remain virtual, with a return date to be determined.

Parents/guardians need to register their student(s) for their desired instructional model -- either in-person or online.

- Student registration will be conducted through your Infinite Campus Parent Portal account.
- Please register your student(s) for (either in-person or virtual) **by Sunday, October 18**. If you do not select an instructional model, your student will be registered for in-person instruction.
- The instructional model you select will remain in place through the remainder of this semester (January 15, 2021).
- When selecting your student’s instructional model, please indicate if your student will require bus transportation.

HOW TO REGISTER

INSTRUCTION

- All students (regardless of the instructional model) will be taught by a CCSD certified teacher.
- School hours will be determined at a later date once student numbers are finalized.

TRANSPORTING STUDENTS

- Students are expected to practice social distancing at bus stops.
- Students are required to wear masks on the bus.
- All bus drivers/monitors will wear face masks and/or shields and gloves.
- Hand sanitizer is located on all buses. All buses are cleaned after each route.
- Students will sit 2 per seat (maximum of 48 students per bus).
- Students will load the bus from the back and have assigned seats.
- When weather permits, windows will be cracked along with the roof emergency hatches.

HEALTH & SAFETY

WEAR YOUR MASK! WASH YOUR HANDS! WATCH YOUR DISTANCE!

Students (K-12) and staff are required to wear facial coverings, reminded to stay physically distanced as much as possible, and asked to stay home when they are sick. Students exhibiting symptoms at school will be sent home.



Healthy Every Day

1. **Face Coverings:** All faculty, staff, and students are required to wear facial coverings at all times when in close proximity to other people or traveling from one location to another location in buildings.
2. **Physical Distancing:** To every extent possible, students and staff will be encouraged to remain physically distanced from each other throughout the school day.
3. **Waiting Rooms in Schools:** Each school will have a designated space for symptomatic individuals awaiting pick up from their parent/guardian.
4. **Personal Protective Equipment:** Every school will have a PPE supply closet to be used as needed by students and staff.

SCHOOL OPERATIONS

- Increased cleaning and sanitizing of all buildings.
- Signage posted to promote social distancing and minimize exposure.
- Hand sanitizing stations in all schools.
- Water fountains turned off - students may use bottle refill stations.
- Ensure seating is assigned and consistent each day.
- Ensure there are no shared seating areas in classrooms.
- We are limiting the use of shared classroom supplies, electronic devices, toys, books, games, learning aids, and manipulatives.
- Increased cleaning and disinfecting of frequently touched surfaces and shared materials.
- Ventilation systems are updated and will be frequently monitored. ASHRAE (American Society of Heating Refrigerating and Air Conditioning Engineers) and the EPA (Environmental Protection Agency) mandated our buildings have fresh air mixed into our airflow systems. There are several different ways to bring fresh air into our facilities without opening windows. Both of the above-referenced governance boards post regulations, and CCSD conforms to those regulations.

FEEDING STUDENTS

- Breakfast: Food carts placed in common areas so students can “grab and go” and eat in their classroom.
- Lunch: Students will go through the cafeteria line, social distanced, and eat in designated dining areas (based on the school).
