

Which Plan is Best for Me if I'm Having a Baby?

If you are planning to have a baby next year, which plan will cost the least? The illustration below shows sample delivery costs in three different plan options. Remember— your actual costs will vary depending on your actual care. Your ultimate plan choice should take into account your total health and family needs.
